Ventilated headboards and temporary negative pressure rooms can provide just-in-time surge capacity patient isolation controls during the pandemic or other infectious disease outbreaks. Demand for airborne infection isolation rooms may easily exceed their availability and not all hospitals have them. Until recently, hospitals lacked evidence-based guidance on how to effectively deploy temporary negative pressure controls.
