


Connecticut Students for a Dream Professional Development



In recent months it has become much more commonplace for schools and community organizations to discuss how to support undocumented and immigrant students. This is definitely a positive step forward but in many schools and districts and organizations, an opportunity is being missed to have teachers, counselors, administrators, and other staff trained in how to support and advocate with undocumented students. That is why one of the focuses of Connecticut Students for a Dream's (C4D) College Access Program is offering these trainings. C4D believes that having well trained staff is one of the key components of creating a supportive school or organizational culture for undocumented students. C4D trainings are generally composed of 3 parts:



How long are Professional Development Opportunities with C4D?

Professional development trainings can run anywhere from 1 hours to our full 4 hour UndocuPeer training. We can work to meet your needs but generally to get through all 3 training sections at least 1.5 hours is needed which at least 2 hours being the ideal amount of time.

Who Conducts the Trainings?

One of the unique things about C4D is that we are an organization **led by undocumented youth**. **Our trainings are no different!** We believe that undocumented youth are the experts in their own experiences and provide an invaluable training experience.

Who is the Target Audience for Trainings?

We have done trainings for counselors, ELL teachers/ staff, social workers, college access programs, college admissions, financial aid, other student support staff, full high school staff trainings and many others. We can alter the training to be relevant to specific audiences.
