L+M is wasting patient care dollars. Again.

One year ago today, caregivers at Lawrence + Memorial (L+M) Hospital went on strike to protect acute care services at the hospital.

Acute care services are critical to our patients, their families and our community, and we will fight to protect them. When L+M Corporation put profits before patients, we took a stand. And we thank everyone who came to stand with us.



Ultimately last year, the board that oversees
L+M Corporation allowed at least \$17 million
to be spent on an illegal lock-out of
employees and back wages. And now, one year
later, the corporation is again wasting
patient care dollars.

Over \$100K has been spent on a protracted fight against caregivers at outpatient facilities who are attempting to unite for a voice in decisions that impact patient care.

Our health care professionals are voting with their feet.

They are leaving the hospital and its entities. According to the Connecticut Hospital Association, L+M's vacancy rate for registered nurses and allied health professionals is twice the state's average.

A year after L+M locked out its employees, we want to thank those caregivers who returned, and have remained to provide excellent patient care.

We still believe in the promise of our community hospital.
