SUMMARY 2023 LEGISLATIVE GAINS

For retired teachers - the creation of two new seats on the Teachers Retirement Board (TRB) that is exclusively earmarked for retired teachers by the state legislature. The terms of office for these two retiree seats is four years. This will assure that the balance between current retiree and future retiree benefits are addressed in the TRB.

For all retirees in Connecticut - beginning with the 2024 tax year, the taxation, for Connecticut income tax, of all forms of retirement income can be reduced depending upon your adjusted gross income and filing status. There is potentially significant tax savings.

For all retirees in Connecticut - legislation was passed requiring that hospitals achieve and maintain adequate Registered Nursing staff levels (the number of patients a Registered Nurse is responsible for). This will improve the safety of all hospitalized patients. Decades of Nursing research has shown that when a Registered Nurse cares for too many patients the healthcare outcomes for those patient can be significantly decreased or lead to death. An additional benefit will be the improved working conditions which will go a long way to alleviate the Registered Nurse shortage currently and chronically in CT Hospitals.
